To digitally color images in Photoshop.

Students will digitally color 2 images in Photoshop with the use of tool bar options, adjustment levels, color theory involving swatches and color palettes.

For this assignment student will use the mouse

PHOTOSHOP DEMONSTRATION

INSTRUCTIONS

- Make a New folder and name it:

LastNameFirstInitial_4) COLORING IN PHOTOSHOP

- Select two of the three images download and open them in Photoshop.
- Adjust image levels with: **IMAGE - ADJUSTMENTS - LEVELS**
- Name outline layer outline.

MAKE SURE THAT ALL LINES ARE CONNECTED!

- Use selection tool: **MAGIC WAND, QUICK SELECTION TOOL** to highlight areas to color.
- With the area selected go to **SELECTION - MODIFY - EXPAND (around 3 pixels)**. Zoom in and make sure that the selection is OVER TOP of your lines.
- The first layer made is used for filling in flat colors name the layer: **color fill 1**. Set layer to: MULTIPLY
- The second layer made is used for adding shading to your colors. Name this layer: **shading 1**. Set layer to: MULTIPLY
- The third layer made is used for adding highlights to your colors. Name this layer: **highlight 1**. Set layer to: NORMAL
- Save files to your
